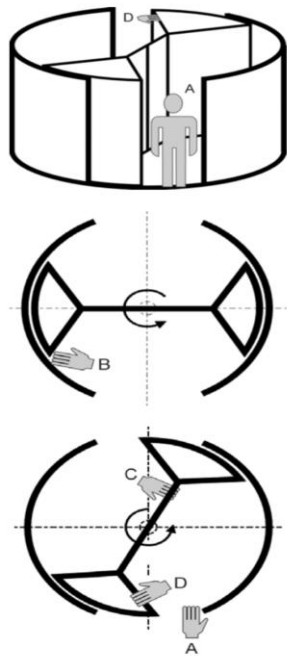

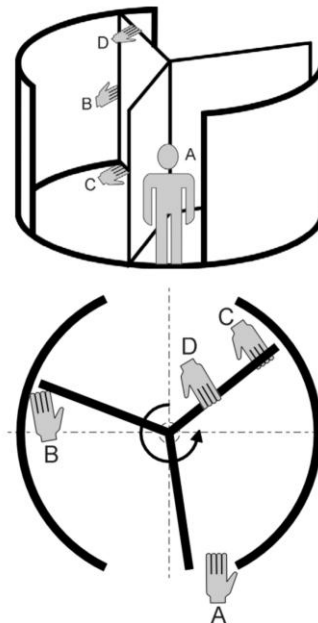
## SAFETY AND OPERATIONAL CONTROLS METHOD

1. Follow step 3-5 of this method statement
2. Ensure safety signs are placed before commencing task
3. Ensure Safety Stop it's activated before starting task
4. Do not wedge or use any equipment to force any door open
5. Do not Attract, occupy the attention or engage into conversations with people or colleagues whilst carrying out the task

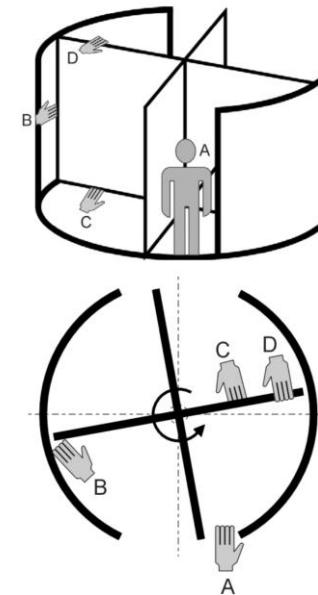
### Types of rotating doors:
